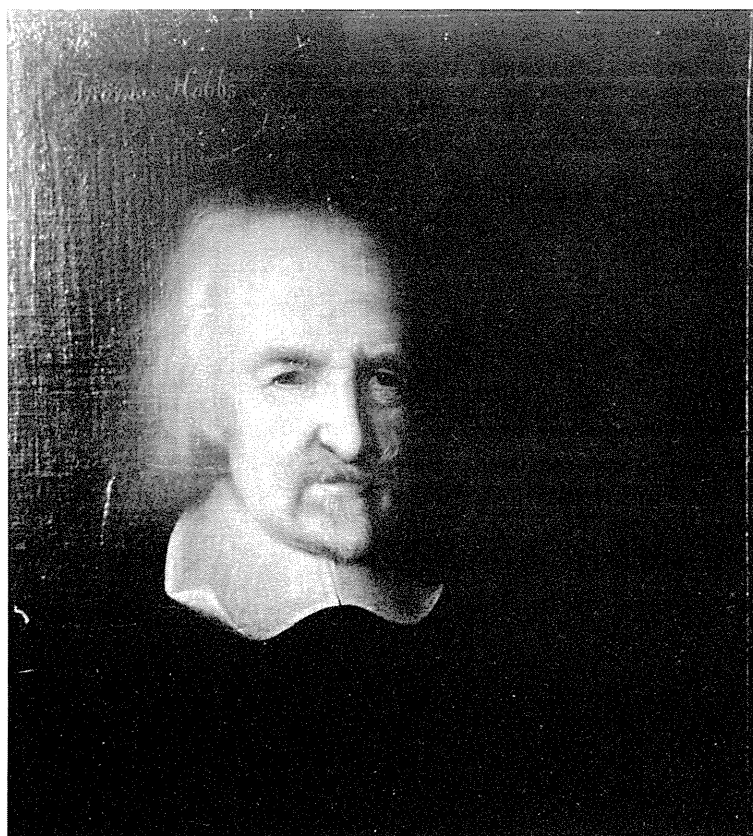

## イギリス近代思想史コレクション

### 第1期 ホッブズとその時代

#### 1

このコレクションは2期にわけて購入されたが、内容も大体ふたつにわけて考えることができる。第1部は、イギリス経験論および近代政治思想の創始者のひとりであるトマス・ホッブズ Thomas Hobbes, 1588—1679 の著作を中心とし、第2部は、かれの大きな影響のもとに展開されるイギリス、フランスの近代思想のながれを示すコレクションである。前者は、イギリスのホッブズ研究者が、戦後30年のあいだに、研究のためにあつめたもので、ホッブズの先駆者、同時代およびその後の批判者・支持者、19・20世紀のホッブズ研究者の著書が、かなり網羅的にあつめられている。後者は、それを補足する意図をもって、イギリスの古書籍商があつめたものであって、内容の緊密さでは前者におとるが、範囲のひろさ、したがって思いがけない収獲の可能性という点では、むしろまさっているといえよう。

第1部は、明確な主題をもって集中的にあつめられたために、密度がたかく、密度の点で国内の他のコレクションとくらべると、小樽商科大学のシェル文庫（フィジオクラシイ）、中央大学のブライス・コレクション（ヒュームおよび理神論）が、これに匹敵するくらいであろう。ホッブズについてこれだけのものは、国内にはもちろんなく、このコレクションのかなりの部分が、日本にはほかにないだろうとおもわれる。外国の図書館でも、イギリス、アメリカあわせて10館ぐらしか、このコレクションのすべてを所蔵しているところはないだろう。

ただ、この部分には、ブランド（Brandt, F.）、ゴシアー（Gauthier, D. P.）、フッド（Hood, F. C.）、ランゲ（Lange, F. A.）、ミンツ（Mintz, S. I.）、パウエル（Powell, A.）、スピंक（Spink, J. S.）、スティーヴン（Stephen, L.）、テニエス（Tönnies, F.）、ウォリンダー（Warrender, H.）などの、現代のホッブズ（およびその周辺）研究書がはいっていて、このことは当初の収集目的からみれば当然なのであるが、貴重書コレクションとしては、これらを包含すべき理由はない。

もうひとつ、ふつうのコレクションにない特徴として、ホッブズの肖像画が、5点あつめられていることを、あげておかなければならない。ホッブズの肖像については、D. N. B. にレズリー・スティーヴンが、「J. M. ライト（Wright, J. M.）によるかれの肖像画が国立肖像画館にあり、ふたつを王立アカデミーが所有している。クーパー（Cooper, S.）によるひとつの肖像画が、まえには王室コレクションのなかにあった」（P. 936）とかいている。本コレクションの5点は、ライトの作品を模写した（あるいはライト自身がかいた）とおもわれる無署名の油絵がひとつと、4枚の版画であって、版画のうちの最もあたらしいものを別とすれば、原画は王立アカデミー所蔵（ドブスン Dobson, W. 作）、デヴォンシャー・ハウス所蔵、ドーシト女公所蔵と、すべてちがっている。この3点が、スティーヴンがあげた3点と一致するかどうかは、わからないし、現在、ハードウィックのデヴォンシャー公邸にある、おそらく最晩年の肖像は、本コレクションの原画のなかにふくまれていない



(なお、以上のほかに、ハードウィックには、胸像があり、またリヴァイアサンの口絵が、ホッブズの肖像だという説がある)。

ギリシャの思想家のなかで、アリストテレス (Aristoteles)、ホメロス (Homerus)、トゥキディデース (Thucydides) がおおいのは、ホッブズが翻訳をするほどに、かれらの著作にしたしんでいたから、とうぜんであり、ほかにはギリシャ・ローマのものは数点しかない。聖書は、ホッブズの教会批判の典拠であったが、かれが『リヴァイアサン』でしつように反論した枢機卿ベラルミーノ (Bellarmino, F.R.) の著作がないのは、さびしい。カトリックを代表するものとして、ボシュエ (Bossuet, J.B.) があるが、かれの著作活動は、ほとんどホッブズ死後のことであった。むしろ、同時代の法王派としては、ウィリアム・バークレー (Barclay, W.) をあげるべきであろう。アングロ・カソリック (国教会右派) としては、論敵ブラムホール (Bramhall, J.) (アーマー司教) や、ホッブズがフランス亡命中に熱病で死ぬかとおもわれた時に、聖礼をささげたコージン (Cosin, J.) (ダラム司教) の著体があり、国教会の反法王派としては、トマス・バーロウ (Barlow, T.) (リンカン司教) がある。これに対して、ホッブズが法王至上権とともに批判するプロテスタントの、暴君放伐論を代表する著作はみあたらない (テオドル・ベザ Beza, T.) の名は、聖書の附録としてでている)。

慣習法 (普通法) 学者として、ホッブズの批判の的となったクック (Coke, E.) の著作は、2 種類、4 点で、そのうち『リトルトン註釈』とよばれる *Institutes* は、生存中に出版された第 1 部だけで、かれと検事総長の地位をあらそった (クックがかった) ベイコン (Bacon, F.) の 7 種類 9 点にくらべてさびしいが、稀少性からいえば前者の方がまさっているだろう。ベイコンは、ホッブズを書記としていたこともあり、思想的系譜からみても、ホッブズ、ロック (Locke, J.)、ヒューム (Hume, D.) とともに、イギリス経験論の四巨峯であるから、もっとおおくてもいいのだが、おおくのあたらしい版が利用できるのも、とくにこのコレクションによるまでもないだろう。おなじこととは、ロック、ヒュームについてもいえる (ヒュームはここでは除外されている)。ホワイト (White, T.) は、その著書『世界について』を批判したホッブズの手稿が 1952 年に発見されて、あらためて問題となったが、ここにはいっているのは別の著作である。

フランスの友人としては、デカルト (Descartes, R.)、ガッサンディ (Gassendi, P.)、ソルビエール (Sorbière, S.) があり、デカルトは論敵でもあるが、貴重なのはむしろガッサンディとソルビエールの著作である。

以上は、大体においてホッブズより早い思想家であり、それだからかれの批判の対象となったのであるが、逆にホッブズを批判あるいは継承した思想家がいることは、いうまでもない。おおざっぱに、ホッブズの前と後とわけて、後の部分にうつるまえに、ホッブズ自身の著作にふれておかなければならない。ホッブズ自身の著作については、マクドナルド (Macdonald, H.) とハーグリーヴ

ズ (Hargreaves, M.) の書誌があり、これは 1945 年の書誌学会出版物 (じっさいの出版は 1952 年) であったことから、戦時中の仕事であったとおもわれる。また、最近アメリカででたふたつのホッブズ研究書誌のうち、ヒンナント (Hinnant, C.H.) のものは、1679—1976 年間の、批判と継承およびホッブズ自身の著作の出版をふくんでいるので、このコレクションのうちで、これから説明する部分と対応する。サックスティダー (Sacksteder, W.) のホッブズ研究書誌は、1879—1979 年、つまり最近 100 年間に限定されている。

ホッブズの著作は、モールズワース版著作集に、ほぼ全部あつめられていて、戦後にこれが復刻されたことが、ホッブズ研究のリヴァイヴァルともいえるべき盛況をうみだした一因であったことは、否定できない。しかし、この著作集は、げんみつなテキスト・クリティークを欠いているだけでなく、句読点の現代化やかっここの除去によって、ときには誤解を誘発するおそれさえあるのである。テキスト・クリティークは、『ビヒモス』と『法学要綱』についてはテニエスによって、『リヴァイアサン』については、不十分ながらウォーラー (Waller, A.R.) によっておこなわれたが、後者については、1651 年版と称せられるものが、マクドナルド、ハーグリーヴズがあげた 3 種のなかで、さらに異版をふくむのではないかといわれている。『市民論』について、ウォリンダーの手で進められている作業が、おそらく、はじめて学問的評価にたえるホッブズ著作集を生み出すであろう。

もちろん、そういう著作集がでたところで、それぞれの異版は、直接にみてはじめて意味を確認しうるばあいがあるから、すてるわけにはいかないのだが、現状においては、このコレクションの 50 点をこえるホッブズの著作は、研究者にとっては宝庫なのである。残念なことには、ここには肝心の『リヴァイアサン』のほんものの初版 (タイトル・ページの絵から、Head 版とよばれる) がない。画竜点睛を欠くというべく、別に入手することがのぞましいが、10 年前にニューヨークで 30 万だったものが、現在、京都の古本屋で 300 万円をこえている (海外価格では 150 万ぐらい) しまつたので、かんたんにはいかない。

ただ、ここにふくまれている『修辞術』(162) は、タイトル・ページによっても序文によっても、ホッブズの著作であることを疑う余地がないのだが、1951 年にイギリスとアメリカでほとんど同時に、ハウエル (Howell, W.S.) とオン (Ong, W.) によって、これがフェンナー (Fenner, D.) によるタラエス (Talaesus) の翻訳であることが、あきらかにされた。したがって、これは、ホッブズの著作から除去されるべきものではあるが、タイトル・ページによってカタログすれば、除去できないのである (しかも後半の『哲学者とイギリス法学者の対話』は、まぎれもなくホッブズの著作なのだ)。

ホッブズ批判者として、ここに著作があつめられているのは、前掲のブラムホールのはかに、まず、直接に交友関係のあったクラランダン伯エドワード・ハイド (Hyde, E.) がおり、さらにブランド (Blount, C.)、ボイル (Boyle, R.)、トマス・ブラウン (Browne, T.)、サミュエル・クラーク (Clarke, S.)、コリアー (Collier, J.)、カドワース (Cudworth, R.)、カンバーランド (Cumberland, R.)、イーチャード (Eachard, J.)、フェル (Fell, J.)、フィルマー (Filmer, R.)、ライブニッツ

(Leibniz, G. W.)、ナイクテル (Neikter, J. F.)、オーエン (Owen, J.)、パーカー (Parker, S.)、シャフト (Shafte, J.)、サウス (South, R.)、スティリングフリート (Stillington, E.)、テニスン (Tenison, T.)、ウォリス (Wallis, J.)、セス・ワード (Ward, S.)、ホワイトホール (Whitehall, J.) がある。ケンブリッジ・プラトニストが、カドワースによって代表されているのは、とうぜんであろうが、ヘンリ・モア (More, H.) もあり、第2期にはノリス (Norris, J.) がある。

ホッブズ継承者としては、ロックはいうまでもないが、理神論者とフランス唯物論者および解放主義者 Libertarians があり、このグループは、ここにはあまりあつめられていない。理神論の先駆としては、チャーベリのハーバート (Herbert, E.)、シャーフツベリ伯 (Shaftesbury) があり、フランス唯物論者としてエルヴェシウス (Helvétius, C. A.) がある程度であって、むしろさいごのリベルトンとして、ダニエル・スカージル (Scargill, D.) とロチェスター伯ウィルモット (Wilmot, J.) (いずれもホッブズ主義者として処罰された) があることを指摘しておくべきであろう。理神論ということばは、かなりあいまいで、歴史的な変化もあり、理神論者の範囲を確定することは困難であるが、ハリバートン (Halyburton, T.)、ジョサイア・キング (King, J.)、リーランド (Leland, J.)、スケルトン (Skelton, P.)、などの理神論批判は、おおかれすくなかれ、ホッブズ批判をふくむ。

大陸の自然法学のなかにも、ホッブズへの批判とともに継承をみることができるが、この領域に属する人びととしては、ビュルラマキ (Burlamaqui, J. J.)、ハイネッキウス (Heineccius, J. G.)、フェルトハイゼン (Van Velthuysen,)、プフェンドルフ (Pufendorf, S.) があり、ベッカリーア (Beccaria, C. B.) をつくくわえてもいいかもしれない (ヴォルテール (Voltaire) とともに、フランス唯物論にむすびつけて考えることもできる)。

このようにみえてくると、以上の分類 (もちろん便宜的なものだが) にはいらないものは、それほど多くはない。まず、ギリシャ、ローマの著作が数点、つぎにはホッブズの同時代の、(1) 文学者、(2) 法律家、政治思想家、(3) 神学者として、(1) コットン (Cotton, C.)、カウリー (Cowley, A.)、ダヴナント (D'Avenant, W.)、デュポート (Duport, J.)、ジョン・ヘイルズ (Hales, J.)、ハワード (Horward, E.)、ウォーラー (Waller, E.)、ウェスリー (Wesley, S.) など、(2) ハービン (Harbin, G.)、ニーダム (Nedham, M.)、ネヴィル (Neville, H.)、セルドゥン (Selden, J.)、レン (Wren, M.)、(3) バクスター (Baxter, R.)、ブラント (Browne, T.)、バーネット (Burnet, G.)、チリングワース (Chillingworth, W.)、ハモンド (Hammond, H.)、ユエ (Huet, P. D.)、ジャリジュ (Jarrige, P.)、パスカル (Pascal, B.)、ポヴィー (Povey, C.) などの著作がある。パスカルについては、見かけの対立にもかかわらず、ホッブズからおおきな影響を受けたとする見解が有力であるから、継承者のなかに入れるべきであったかもしれない。

ホッブズおよび同時代者の伝記や手紙もかなりあって、オーブリ (Aubrey, J.)、バリック (Barwick, P.)、ブラックバーン (Blackburne, R.)、ブリットン (Britton, J.)、ビュリニ (Burigny, J. L. de)、グラント (Grant, D.)、ユエ (Huet, P. D.)、マリョット (Marriott, J. A. R.)、メンケ (Mencke, J. B.)、ニューカスル (Newcastle)、セス (Seth) の伝記、アーリントン伯 (Arlington)、パタン (Patin, G.) があり、歴史的著作としてスプラット (Sprat, T.) のアカデミー史とウッド (Wood, A. à) のオ

クスフォード大学史がある。

最後に残ったものをあげておくと、エイキン (Aikin, J.) (ユエの自伝の訳者で、著作集のなかにダヴナント D'Avenant, W. の詩についての評論がある)、ボスカー (Bosker, A.)、バッキンガム公 (Buckingham, J. S.) (後期スチュアート王朝からアン時代にいたる政治家、文芸評論家)、キャンベル (Campbell, A.) (ハチスン Hutcheson, F. と同時代のスコットランドの思想家)、ドゥモーガン (De Morgan, A.) (数学者)、ディズレーリ (Disraeli, I.) (政治家ディズレーリ Disraeli, B. の父、『チャールズ I 世史』で有名だが、『若者たちのあらそい』にはホブズが登場する)、フィールドィング (Fielding, H.) (青年時代にホブズをよみ、作品中でも言及している)、キング (King, W.) (ソルビエールの手紙の訳者)、モンテーニュ (Montaigne, M. E. de)、サント・ブーヴ (Sainte-Beuve, C. A.) (パスカルをあつかう)、ソールズベリ (Salisbury, T.) (数学者らしいが不明)、W. S. (匿名、イーチャードの批判者) および、ほぼ同時代の大陸の法学者、哲学者とおもわれるポリヌス (Polinus, C.) とレギウス (Regius, H.) である。

さいごに、書誌として、ホブズの手紙をふくむ、ポートランド公のウェルベック僧院文庫のカタログがあり、オクスフォード大学の禁書目録ならびに言論統制書が、英語とラテン語ではいつている。もちろん、禁書のなかにホブズの著作があり、大学がこれらをやきすてたのである。

ホブズの影響 (反論もふくめて) は、17世紀にかぎっても、ここにあげられただけではない。たとえば、ミンツは、1650 - 1700 年の反ホブズ文献を、約 100 点あげている。せめてそのくらいは、コピーでいいから、そろえることが、このホブズ・コレクションを、全国の共同利用に供する側の責任であろう。

### I 収 録 対 象

この目録は「イギリス近代思想史原典コレクション 第Ⅰ期 ホッブズとその時代」の蔵書 336点(MS, 肖像画を含む)を収録したものである。

### II 配 列

- i) 配列は著者名のアルファベット順とし、同一著者の文献は、著者名のもとでの書名のアルファベット順とした。ただし翻訳書は原本の次に配列されている。
- ii) 著者不明のもの、あるいは多人数による著作は書名のアルファベット順とし、著者名の中に混配した。
- iii) マニュスクリプト、ポートレート類はまとめて、目録最終部分に別配列した。

### III 記 述

- i) 記述は英米目録規則北米版 1967 年版によったが、1800 年以前の本については、その特殊性から若干の修正をほどこした。
- ii) 著者名は米国議会図書館の目録に準拠した。
- iii) 2 冊以上の著作が合本されているものは、それぞれの著作について記述を作成し、合本注記をほどこした。
- iv) 記述の順序は、著者名・書名・出版地、出版者、出版年・頁数(巻数)・大きさ・注記・典拠・登録番号の順とした。
- v) 右肩の数字はこの目録の書誌一連番号である。

### IV 索 引

著作中に著作名が明らかにされていないもの、及び聖書等形式的な標目で配列されているものについてのみ書名索引を作成した。
