## イギリス近代思想史コレクション

### 第2期 イギリス近代思想の諸潮流

#### 1

第1期とちがって、第2期はホッブズという中心がなく、やや散漫という印象をぬぐいきれないが、それだからかえって、さまざまな角度からの利用が可能なのである。

内容を大別すれば、もちろん最大の部分は17～18世紀のイギリス思想であるが、そのほかに、古代ギリシャ・ローマ思想；フランス啓蒙思想；および16～19世紀イギリス・フランスの論理学・教育論などがある。以下、ほぼこの分類にしたがって説明していくことにしよう。

I. もっともすくないのは古代ギリシャ・ローマ思想であって、ギリシャ語新約聖書（1519年バーゼル版）、エウクレイデス『幾何学要論』イギリス訳初版（1570年？）のほかに、プラトン、エピクテートゥス、クセノフォン、キケロ、マルクス・アウレリウス、セネカのイギリス訳が、ここにふくまれる。エウクレイデスについては、ホッブズが偶然にこれをよんで、幾何学との恋におちいったという説があり、かれはそれから、幾何学的方法による政治学の構想にとりかかったという。このほか、マキアヴェルリの『君主論』と『カストルッチオ・カストラカーニ伝』のイギリス訳、ジェサップの『ピコおよびパスカル伝』（トマス・モアのピコ・デラ・ミランドラ伝とペリエ夫人のパスカル伝による）は、パスカル伝をのぞけば、ルネサンス期の代表的著作ではあるが、このコレクションのなかでは例外的な存在である。

II. 1. 最大部分は、さらにいくつかに分けることができるが、まずホッブズの直接の先行者と同時代者の著作42点をあげなければならない。このなかには、ホッブズ自身の著作が4点ふくまれているほかに、フランシス・ベイコン Francis Bacon、カンバランド R. Cumberland、イーチャード J. Eachard、ハリントン J. Harrington、ウォード S. Ward などのように、直接にホッブズとかわりがあった人びと、カドワース R. Cudworth、モア H. More、ノリス J. Norris、などのケンブリジ・プラトニストの著作がある。ヘイル M. Hale も、ホッブズの法学者批判に反論した人であるが、この反論は出版されていない。なお、ホッブズとの関係は今後の研究にまたなければならない部分がおおいが、16世紀のポネット J. Ponet やスミス T. Smith からジェイムズ1世 James I、ナサニエル・ベイコン N. Bacon<sup>1)</sup>にいたる先行者の著作も無視できない。そのなかには、チャーベリのハーバート E. Herbert や『メランコリの分析』のバートン R. Burton のように、よく知られているものだけでなく、王党派のウォリック P. Warwick とオールズトゥリー R. Allestree、アルマー大司教アッシャー J. Ussher、ピュアリタン神学者ペンブル W. Pemble、モンテニューの亜流といわれるコーンウォールズ W. Cornwallis、無名のタヴィル D. Tuwill がいる。アール J. Earle の著書は、革命前の人物・思想のスケッチとして有名であるが、ホッブズとの直接の交渉はなかったようである。リー E. Leigh の著書も、ホッブズの時代の思想的危機感を反映する。

II. 2. つぎは、名誉革命以降、すなわちロック J. Locke、テンプル W. Temple、ハリファクス公



セヴィル G. Savile、名譽革命期の政治家ウォリントン伯 1st Earl of Warrington から、理神論論争を経てバークリ G. Berkeley にいたるグループであるが、大陸の同時代者としてプーフENDORF S. v. Pufendorf とフリース G. de Vries がある。前者については説明はいらないであろうし、著書も第一期の 272 と重複している。後者は、ウトレヒト大学の哲学の教授で、デカルトの生得観念説への強硬な反対者であった。しかし全体としては伝統的な哲学の信奉者であつたらしく、イギリスの非国教徒牧師でかれのもとにまなんだカラミ E. Calamy が、自伝で言及している。それがフリースについてのほとんど唯一の資料であるらしいということ自体、当時の学界情況・国際思想交流のありかたをしめすものといえる。

ロックの『基督教の合理性』、『人間知性論』、『教育論』は初版であるが、『統治論』はそうではない。『統治論』の初版は、現在わかっているかぎりでは、日本では、慶応大学の高橋誠一郎コレクションにしかない。

理神論というのは、範囲の確定が困難だとまゝに書いておいたように、攻撃する側からはホッブズ、ロック、シャーフツベリまでも目標とされることがある。そういうばくぜんとした枠で考えると、ここでは、理性と宗教の関係を論じたグランヴィル J. Glanvill を、理神論論争のはじめにおいていいであろう。その枠をひろくとれば、カソリックの論客サージェント J. Sergeant のロック批判、ブラント C. Blount のホッブズ批判にはじまって、マンドヴィル B. Mandeville 『蜂の寓話』とデニス J. Dennis によるその批判までをふくめることができる。このなかには、マンドヴィルの前掲書やシャーフツベリ 3rd Earl of Shaftesbury の主著と手紙のように、とくにめずらしいとはいえないものもあるが、シャーフツベリ批判者として有名なブラウン J. Brown の著作が 5 点（そのうち 2 点は重複）もそろっているのはめずらしい。ややせまい枠での理神論論争ということになれば、バクスター A. Baxter、バトラー J. Butler、チャブ T. Chubb、コリアー J. Collier、ギボンズ T. Gibbons、ギルドン C. Gildon、ヒューバー M. Huber、ジョンソン T. Johnson、ラザフォース T. Rutherford、シャーロック W. Sherlock、サイクス A. A. Sykes、ティンドゥル M. Tindal、ウォッツ I. Watts、ウラストン W. Wollaston をあげることができる。カソリックの医者であるアバクロンビーも、ここにいれていいかもしれない。ティンドゥルは、主著がなく残念だが、ここにあげたほとんどすべての著者について（おそらくバクスター、バトラー、ウラストンをのぞいて）、日本のなかでその著書を利用することは、これまでは不可能であつたとおもわれる。

バークリ J. Berkeley の著作 14 点は、全集にもはいっているので、書誌学的興味をべつにすれば、とりたてていう必要はないかもしれないが、このなかには、ニュートンをもまきこんだ数学・光学・神学論争があつて、ベイズ T. Bayes、ジュリン J. Jurin、ロビンズ B. Robins、ロウニング J. Rowning、テイラー B. Taylor、ウォルトン J. Walton はその関係者である。

II. 3. 第 3 のグループとしては、ハチスン F. Hutcheson、ヒューム D. Hume からコウバーン H. Cockburn にいたるスコットランド啓蒙関係の著作 24 点がある。ここにふくまれるラムジー A. M. Ramray、ケイムズ Lord Kames、ジェラード A. Gerard、リード T. Reid、マキントッシュ J. Mackintosh、スメリー W. Smellie、フォリスター J. Forrester、スミス Sydney Smith などの著作は、名古屋大学には中央図書館および経済学部図書室にすでにかなりあるので、あわせて利用

されることがのぞましい。このコレクション自体としてはむしろ、スミス S. S. Smith のケイムズ批判、ブラウン A. Browne のモンボド批判に注目すべきであろう。あとであげる政治学・経済学関係のグループのアリスン A. Alison とブルーアム H. Brougham も、スコットランド啓蒙に属することは、いうまでもないが、ブルーアムは、アースキン T. Erskine と同様、出身はスコットランドでも活動の舞台はイングランドであった。アースキンは、フランス革命の波及におびえた政府の、ペインその他への弾圧に反対した、特異な法律家（のちに大法官）である。

II. 4. これと並行する18世紀のイングランドの思想を、第4のグループとすれば、そこにはスウィフト J. Swift の有名な『ドレイピアの手紙』をはじめとして、バーク E. Burke、デフォー D. Defoe、フィールディング H. Fielding、ギボン E. Gibbon（および批判者としてのミルナー J. Milner、ヤング J. Young）、ゴドウィン W. Godwin、ハートリ D. Hartley（および批判者としてのベリントン J. Berington）、ジョンソン S. Johnson、ペイリ W. Paley、プライス R. Price（および批判者としてのリヴァーズ男爵 Baron Rivers, G. Pitt）、プリーストリ J. Priestley、ヤング A. Young というような、あらためて説明を必要としない人びとの著作（ただし、バーク、プライス、プリーストリ以外は各人の著作の点数は少なくない）のほかに、アメリカ革命にも影響をあたえたといわれるバラ J. Burgh、ホリス（共和主義的出版活動で有名、ハーヴァード大学への図書の寄贈者）の伝記をかいたブラックバーン F. Blackburne、ペイリの解説者でもある道徳哲学者ギズボーン T. Gisborne、言語学・美学者ハリス J. Harris、画家ホガース W. Hogarth、刑務所改革者ハワード J. Howard、奴隷解放とアメリカ独立を主張したシャープ G. Sharp、古典学者テイラー J. Taylor（かれのローマ法解説はウォーバトンの攻撃をうけた）、奴隷解放運動の創始者ウィルバフォース W. Wilberforce、フランクリンの友人で非国教徒牧師であったウィリアムズ D. Williams、議会改革のヨークシャ運動の指導者ワイヴィル C. Wyvill（ただし、ここにあるのは宗教論だが、これはめずらしい）がある。

以上のほかに、このグループにはいるもののしては、W. Baker, J. Barwis, W. Fitzherbert, C. Howe, R. Hurd, S. Jenyns, W. Kenrick, V. Knox, C. Moore, T. Nettleton, U. Price, H. Repton, J. Usher, N. Torriano があり、その大半は無名である。また、『人間の愛情の本性、起源、進歩』An essay concerning ... the human affections は、著者をたしかめることができないし、エドワーズ J. Edwards は、このコレクションでは例外的に、アメリカの神学者である。

III. 大陸の啓蒙思想のなかでは、フランスが圧倒的におおく、ドイツはカントとヴォルフしかない。フランス啓蒙思想も、棒をひろげてルネサンスまでふくめて考えると、モンテーニュ M. de Montaigne、シャロン P. Charron、サシ L. de Sacy、シロン Silhon, J. de、フルーリ C. Fleury、マルブランシュ N. Malebranche、ダニエル G. Daniel にはじまってヴォルテール Voltaire、モンテスキュー baron de La Brède et de Montesquieu、デュクロ C. P. Duclos、ルソー J. J. Rousseau、エルヴェシウス C. A. Helvétius、ラメトリ J. O. de La Mettrie などが、おおくはイギリス訳であつめられている。これらのうち、いわゆる有名思想家の著作は、とくにめずらしいものではないが、ヴォ

ルテールの『イギリス人についての手紙』は、フランス語版よりはよい版なので重要である。デュプレーン C. Duplain、ギオン C. M. Guyon、アレル M. M. Harel の著書は、それぞれ、ヴォルテールの反論・解説・伝記であり、リュザック E. Luzac はラ・メトリーの批判者である。ブージャンは、この著作のために投獄されたジェジュイトの神父で、これはデカルト批判・聖書批判である。

のこりのうち、ボワイエ A. Boyer の編書は、愛と友情にかんする文章を枢機卿ベントヴィヴォリオ以下の各国の著者からあつめたものであり、バリュエル A. de Barruel の著書はジャコバン主義批判で、デュタン L. Dutens の著書は、古代・近代優劣論争の一部とみていいであろう。ルブラン J. B. Le Blanc は、イギリス事情にくわしく、ヒュームの『政治論集』の訳者でもあったが、『イギリス・フランス国民についての手紙』は、初版が 1745 年で、ヴォルテールの『手紙』の約 10 年あとであるから、その意味でも注目される。

Ⅳ. 19 世紀イギリス思想を代表するものとしては、ベンサム J. Bentham からミル J. S. Mill、カーライル T. Carlyle までの著作があるが、そのうちベンサムの著作は 22 点で、このグループのなかばにちかい。かれの全著作からすれば大した量ではないとはいえ、全集の刊行のいちじるしい停滞と日本における資料蓄積のとばしさを考えると、やはり注目されていいはずである。このグループには、著名な人びととしては上記 3 名のほかに、ブルーアム H. Brougham、コベット W. Cobbett、コールリッジ S. T. Coleridge、ハズリット W. Hazlitt、モア H. More があり、さらに、ブルーアムとともにスコットランド啓蒙にいれるべきかともおもわれるダンカン J. Duncan、ギフォード A. Gifford、マレー H. Murray、セヴィル D. Savile がある。ベイリ S. Bailey は、日本ではもっぱら経済学者として知られているが、ここには言論出版にかんする著作がはいっている。コフーン P. Colquhoun はロンドンの警視総監で、オーエンの自伝にも登場する人物、ヒル M. D. Hill は刑法改革者、キングズミル J. Kingsmill は刑務所改革者、ラッセル J. R. Russell は教会改革者であるが、ベイツ E. Bates とミルンズ R. Milnes についてはわからない。

以上は、大体、時代と国によってわけてみたのだが、そのほかに、主題として重要なものがふたつある。第一は政治経済、第二は論理・教育・雄弁・作法である。論理と作法は無縁のようにみえるが、論理学は思考方法の学として教育学につらなり、作法は「しつけ」として考えられた教育である。

Ⅴ. 政治経済といえば、すでにマキアヴェルリ、ルソー、マンドヴィル、ベンサム、ミルなどの多数の著作があげられたわけだが、ここにはやや狭義の、したがって主として時論的なものをあげる。それはチェンバレン E. Chamberlayne、ペティ W. Petty からホイール W. Hoyle までの 24 点で、なかには、時論とはいえないマルサス R. Malthus の 3 点もある。ただし、マルサスの『人口論』はなくて、パウエル R. Powell、ハズリット W. Hazlitt、サドラー M. T. Sadler、アリスン A. Alison、ソーントン W. T. Thornton の人口論がある。

以上のほかに、Baron Auckland (W. Eden)、F. Brewster、T. Chalmers、T. Dangerfield、J. Davison、Baron Farnborough (C. Long)、J. Hanway、W. Lee、R. North、G. Rose、J. St. John、C. Vernon、R. Walpole があり、ダヴナント C. Davenant がかけた輸出入総監への報告書 (Gt. Brit. Inspector General をみよ)、キング C. King が中心であった The British Merchant、ブリティシュ・リネン会社の特

許状のほかに、匿名書が5点ふくまれる (An abstract, A letter from an English merchant, A letter from a member of the House of Commons, A letter to Sir R..., The use and abuse of money)。

VI. 論理学・教育学の関係では、政治経済の項がイギリスだけだったのとちがって、フランス書がおおくなる。これには、一方でポール・ロワイヤル論理学、他方でフランス絶対王政の宮廷作法などの影響があるだろう。

VI. 1. 論理学の領域では、そのアルノー A. Arnauld の『論理学』(アルノー、ニコル共著、いわゆるポール・ロワイヤル論理学) は、フランス語とイギリス訳とがはいっていて、そのうえ、ラミー B. Lamy の著書にまで、ポール・ロワイヤルの名前がつかわれているが、ラミーはオラトワール派であって、ポール・ロワイヤルには属しない。クック Z. Coke については DNB にも、W.S. Howell, *Logic and Rhetoric in England, 1500-1700*, Princeton U. P. 1956 にも言及がない。ウィルキンズ J. Wilkins はロイヤル・ソサイエティの創立にあたって中心的役割をえんじた人で、ここにはいつているかれの主著は、一種の辞書である。フラー T. Fuller は天然痘の研究史上にのこる医者であって、肉体的な健康だけでなく、精神的なそれについても配慮したことのあるが、ここにある著書であろう。ロウソン J. Lawson とシェリダン T. Sheridan は、18世紀の弁論術のなかで有名であり、シェリダンは、1761年にエディンバラでスコットランドの知識人たちに標準英語の講義をした。

VI. 2. 狭義の教育学では、すでにロック、ケイムズ、プリーストリ、ブルーアムなどがあったが、さらにつぎのようにアスカム R. Ascham から ケイ・シャトルワースまでの59点をあげることができる。

イギリス—— R. Ascham, T. Babington, T. Baker, J. Barclay, W. Barrow, J. B. Brown, G. Chapman, Earl of Chesterfield, J. Clarke, J. C. Colquhoun, R. Dodsley, H. Fearon, J. Fletcher, R. Gilbert, J. Hanway, A. Hill, L. Hoare, W. F. Hook, T. Hunter, Incorporated Clergy Ophan Society, T. Jarrold, J. Kay, J. P. Kay-Shuttleworth, H. R. Kingscote, M. Le Prince de Beaumont, L. Maidwell, H. More, H. Miller, J. Nelson, R. Newton, Omega, S. Penton, J. Perry, Philanthropos, J. Poole, 7th Earl of Shaftesbury, W. Shepherd, T. Sheridan, D. Stow, E. T. B. Twisleton, W. J. Unwin, O. Walker, C. Wase, T. Wrigley. 匿名の The methods used for erecting charity-schools, Plans of the sunday schools, Suggestions relative to a system of national education.

フランス、イタリア、スペイン—— L.A. de Caraccioli, J. Huarte de San Juan, A. L. J. Laborde, marquise de Lambert.

VI. 3. 教育のなかには礼儀作法から会話術や人生論まで、さまざまなものがふくまれうるし、それらは、また、論理学・習俗論・弁論術・宗教論・道徳哲学につながる。つぎにあげるのは、そのような意味での教育論である。ここではイギリスが11、その他が14となる。

イギリス—— T. R. Birks, Earl of Chesterfield, W. Cobbett, W. Darrell, W. De Britaine, M. Hill, E. B. Joceline, C. Lamb (『レスター夫人の学校』をここにいれていいかどうか疑問だが)、W. Mackenzie. ほかに匿名で The English Theophrastus, The man of manners.

フランス、イタリア、スペイン—— J. Abbadie, D. Bouhours, L. A. de Caraccioli, G. della

Casa, J. J. Duguet, N. Faret, B. Gracián y Morales, J. Huarte de San Juan, Le Pileur d'Apligny, F. A. P. de Moncrif, N. Rémond des Cours, E. F. de Vernage.

スウェーデン—— C. G. Tessin.

V. 自然科学関係では、ニュートン、バークリを中心とするグループをまえにあげたが、そのほかに、Religio Medici の著者ブラウン T. Browne の自然誌的著作（リンネウスの先駆といわれる）、バクスター A. Baxter の自然神学的宇宙誌があり、医学では、エディンバラ大学教授グレゴリ J. Gregory の人間論とエディンバラ哲学協会の論文集がある。バクスターは、アバディーン大学の出身で、ウィルクスの友人であった。

以上にみてきたように、著書がもっともおおくあつめられているのは、ベンサムとバークリとブリストリであって、全集がでていないベンサムとブリストリのばあいはいうまでもなく、全集があるバークリについても、論争書がつけくわえられているために、いずれもこのコレクションの主要な魅力をなしている。

しかし、それにもおとらず重要なこのコレクションの特徴は、研究史上比較的しられていない、おおくの著作がふくまれていることであって、それらは文字どおり玉石混淆ではあるだろうが、この世界では、ほりだしたものが玉であるか石であるかは、しばしば研究者の腕しだいなのである。なお、それらの著者について、この解説のなかで与えた規定は、あくまで暫定的便宜的なものであるから、研究者がそれにとらわれないようにおねがいたい。

これらの古典は、ほとんど当時の製本のままであるから、その状態によってはコピーがとれない。しかし、オルムス、ガーランド、フロンマンなどによる復刻版も購入しつつあるので、コピーにさいしては、それを利用されたい。マイクロフィルムによるコピーが、すでにつくられていることもある。

# 凡 例

今回の第Ⅱ期目録は、第Ⅰ期目録「ホップズとその時代」の編集方針と若干異なっている。第Ⅰ期は17世紀の出版物が主であったため、より詳細な書誌的事項の記述に力をそそいだが、今回は利用の便を考慮し、著者名・書名等の索引作成に重点を置いた。従って、注記等の記述は、第Ⅰ期目録より、いくらか簡略化した。

## I 収 録 対 象

この目録は「イギリス近代思想史原典コレクション 第Ⅱ期 イギリス近代思想の諸潮流」の蔵書450点を収録したものである。

## II 配 列

- i) 配列は著者名のアルファベット順とし、同一著者の文献は、著者名のもとでの書名のアルファベット順とした。ただし翻訳書は原本の次に配列されている。
- ii) 著者不明のもの、あるいは多人数による著作は書名のアルファベット順とし、著者名の中に混配した。

## III 記 述

- i) 記述は英米目録規則北米版1967年版によったが、1800年以前の本については、Bibliographic description of rare books (L.C., 1981)等を参考にして、その特殊性から若干の修正をほどこした。
- ii) 著者名は米国議会図書館の目録に準拠した。
- iii) 2冊以上の著作が合本されているものは、それぞれの著作について記述を作成し、合本注記をほどこした。
- iv) 記述の順序は、著者名・書名・出版地、出版者、出版年・頁数(巻数)・大きさ・注記・典拠・登録番号の順とした。
- v) 右肩の数字はこの目録の書誌一連番号である。

## IV 索 引

目録記述中表示され、検索キーとして重要な著者、編者、訳者、被伝者、献辞者等の人名及び団体名をもって Index I(Personal and corporate names)、本書名、別書名、欄外書名等をもって Index II(Title names)を作成し各々アルファベット順に配列した。なお、第Ⅰ期「ホップズとその時代」の目録中、標目とした人名については Index I の各項目の先頭に※印を付し参照の便をはかった。
