



- Pattern two: Bubble diagram
 - Write your general topic.
 - Think of ideas related to the topic.
 - Write them down with a line showing connection to the topic.
 - Think of ideas related to those ideas.
 - Write them down lines showing connections.
 - Don't worry about order; you can jump around.





- Pattern three: free writing
 - Write your topic sentence.
 - Write whatever ideas come into your mind next.
 - Don't stop writing for five minutes.
 - Don't worry about grammar or spelling.
 - Don't worry if your ideas are good or bad, just keep writing.
